THE SEASON IS — the Season after Pentecost—sometimes called Ordinary Time. This season begins after the feast of Pentecost and runs through to the first Sunday of Advent. The focus of the season is the daily Christian life — life lived in the light of the resurrection, in the faith that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ. The liturgical color of the season is green.

STEWARDSHIP— What a difference it would have made for Lazarus if the rich man, had showed him even an iota of the mercy and favor God had modeled for him in his pampered life. But the scales are eventually balanced, and Lazarus finds a lasting home near God, while the rich man is condemned to suffer for eternity. How often do we question why “bad things happen to good people”, but take little comfort in God’s promise to balance the scales gloriously in His good time? Must be because we’re human and can never know the many mysteries of God...we just have to trust...and how hard and unsatisfying that can be!

The Lesson

Jeremiah 32:1-3a, 6-15

The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord in the tenth year of King Zedekiah of Judah, which was the eighteenth year of Nebuchadrezzar. At that time the army of the king of Babylon was besieging Jerusalem, and the prophet Jeremiah was confined in the court of the guard that was in the palace of the king of Judah, where King Zedekiah of Judah had confined him. Jeremiah said, The word of the Lord came to me: Hanamel son of your uncle Shallum is going to come to you and say, "Buy my field that is at Anathoth, for the right of redemption by purchase is yours." Then my cousin Hanamel came to me in the court of the guard, in accordance with the word of the Lord, and said to me, "Buy my field that is at Anathoth in the land of Benjamin, for the right of possession and redemption is yours; buy it for yourself." Then I knew that this was the word of the Lord. And I bought the field at Anathoth from my cousin Hanamel, and weighed out the money to him, seventeen shekels of silver. I signed the deed, sealed it, got witnesses, and weighed the money on scales. Then I took the sealed deed of purchase, containing the terms and conditions, and the open copy; and I gave the deed of purchase to Baruch son of Neriah son of Mahseiah, in the presence of my cousin Hanamel, in the presence of the witnesses who signed the deed of purchase, and in the presence of all the Judeans who were sitting in the court of the guard. In their presence I charged Baruch, saying, Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Take these deeds, both this sealed deed of purchase and this open deed, and put them in an earthenware jar, in order that they may last for a long time. For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Houses and fields and vineyards shall again be bought in this land.

The Epistle


1 Timothy 6:6-19

Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will bring about at the right time-- he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen. As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

He said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house-- for I have five brothers-- that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' He said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.'"



NOTES ON THE ANTHEM from our Director of Music:

My first Sunday at Trinity as your Director of Music was Sunday, September 26, 2021. THANK YOU for welcoming me, and my husband, Michael, with open arms and hearts. It has been an honor and a pure delight to make a joyful noise unto the Lord every Sunday with the members of this congregation, especially the talented and dedicated singers in the Trinity choir. To acknowledge this one-year anniversary of joyous music-making, I have selected a new work, in the grand Anglican/English Cathedral tradition, as today’s anthem. It was composed by 43 year-old British composer Philip W.J. Stopford. His work, entitled “Like The Colors Of The Rainbow,” was just published a few months ago. Philp Stopford was trained in the high Anglican style at the most prestigious Anglican musical sites, including, among many others, Westminster Abbey, Truro Cathedral, Canterbury Cathedral and Chester Cathedral. He also spent five years here in the United States, serving at Christ Church in Bronxville, NY, from 2016 to 2021, before returning to the UK in late 2021. I believe the text of this new work perfectly encapsulates what my hope has been for our wonderful music program here at Trinity. It is an anthem that lifts up and celebrates diversity in many aspects of congregational life, including the musical life of a congregation. I also believe it honors our proud Episcopalian and Anglican musical heritage in its style, but also helps us look to the future since it has been composed by one of that tradition’s most exciting LIVING composers.
