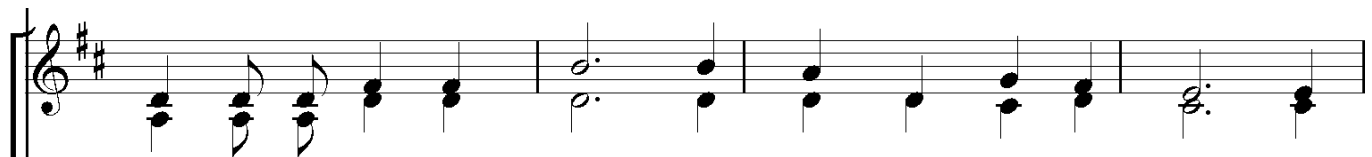

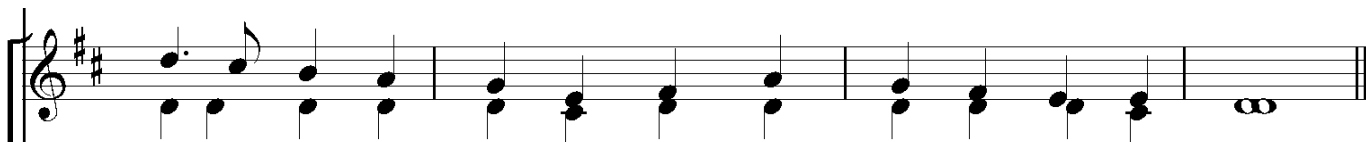

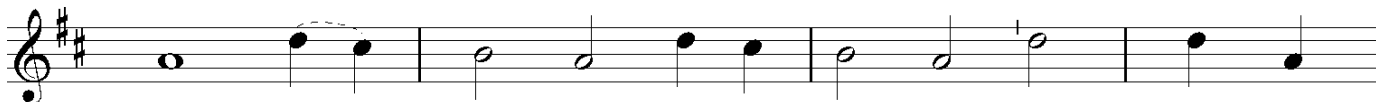

The Nicene Creed

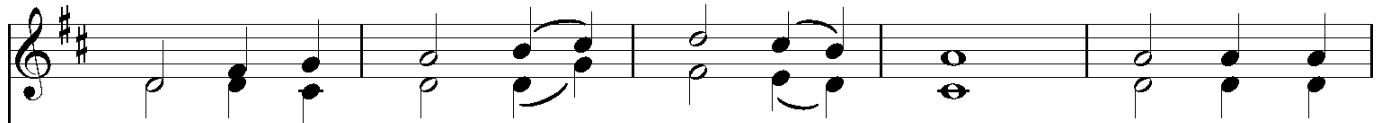


